

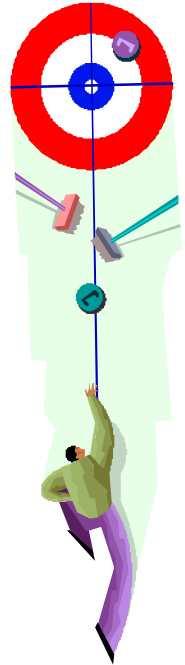

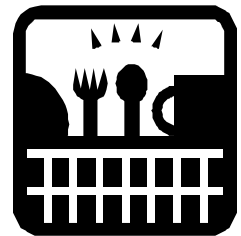

GYMNASTICS CANADA INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP AWARD 2006



Fay Weiler

This award is presented for long time exceptional contribution and leadership in the development and advancement of gymnastics at the International level.

Since 1961 Fay has served in various roles in the many different areas of international sport.

As a judge she participated in 3 Olympic Games, 4 World Championships, 8 Pacific Alliance Championships, 5 Commonwealth Games, 4 Pan American Games plus countless other international competitions.

Fay was Canada's representative at more than 18 FIG Congresses. During those years she represented Canada at almost all Pacific Alliance Congresses, Commonwealth Confederation AGM's, Commonwealth Games Congresses, and Pan Am Games Congresses, etc. Within those groups Fay worked on the development and regular updating of Technical Regulations, Structure, Programs and competitions and served as Secretary for the Commonwealth Gymnastics Confederation and for the PANGF. The latter position she continues to hold.

Fay was very instrumental in the election of two Canadians to the FIG Executive and two to the PANGF Executive.

Because of her continued exposure and involvement over so many years Fay's role evolved into a behind the scenes role of interaction, influence, information, advisory, assistance, etc. She contributed greatly to the international growth and evolution of the sport .

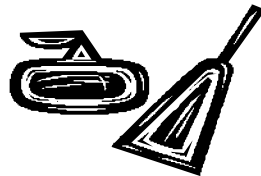

Curl for the Cure

The 10th Anniversary of "Curl for the Cure" will be celebrated on Saturday, November 18, when the Annual Women's Charity Bonspiel will be held at the London Curling Club. Proceeds from Entry Fees, Pledges, Silent Auction and Corporate Contributions will be donated to the London Regional Cancer Centre through the "Rethink Breast Cancer Charity". Proceeds from the Raffle will be donated to Wellspring, in memory of Kit Benson. Since this event began in 1997, a total of \$217,500.14 has been raised! In 2005, \$30,348 was raised, which surpassed our fundraising goal. We hope to raise another \$30,000 this year!
