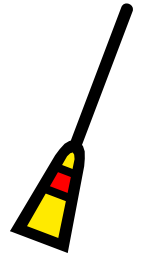

AL AND RUTH PRENTICE 101 YEARS OF CURLING AT THE LONDON CURLING CLUB!



Al Prentice is now in his 52nd year of curling at the Club, having joined in 1959 and Ruth Prentice is in her 49th year, having joined in 1961, a mere 10 years after women were admitted as members. I believe they must be the most senior couple members at the LCC. At that time, Alan Aylsworth was president; the Club offered instruction with one instructor for each two persons; the mixed league curled Friday evening, Saturday afternoon, Sunday afternoon and Sunday evening. Friday evening was potluck after you came off the ice at 9 p.m.. Ruth says that even though women were members, they were not particularly welcome in 1961!!

Ruth remembers thinking what a stupid game, standing around on ice, waiting, while others threw their rocks. However, after learning some of the intricacies of the game, with some help from Ray Turnbull at out-of-town clinics, she changed her mind and soon became the keen competitor that we know.

Al remembers with some nostalgia the corn brooms, followed by the rink rats along with the tremendous noise they created in the arena; the hair brushes with their shedding and the many picks that ensued; and finally, the synthetic brushes of today with their quiet but effective control of the rocks.

Maybe we should try a re-creation of their Thursday evening supper spiels. You had to sign up by Tuesday for the Thursday dinner at a cost of \$2.00. Al remembers a mixed Valentines' event when they were leading 9 to 0 after 5 ends and lost the game 10 to 9. How many of us remember similar games? The curling community was comprised of many community leaders who were fiercely competitive and you had to be careful to make sure it was not your shot(s) that determined the outcome of the game if the team was unsuccessful.

In the '60's, married women did not have jobs and so it was necessary to sign up very early in order to participate in the women's draws at the Club. We wish our leagues were as in demand today!

Al has now graduated to stick curling with the daytime men most Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays. With his one good eye and a mean delivery, he is looking forward to several more years of curling and companionship at the LCC. Ruth still gets into the hack every Thurs. and skips her team; however, on Tuesdays, at the moment, she has moved to the vice position. Ruth says "What a wonderful game. You can curl from age 6 to age 90+ and meet many wonderful people."

We all wish Al and Ruth many more grand experiences with their friends at the London Curling Club.

We are pleased that Larry Round has stepped forward to fill the Treasurers position for the next three years.

The 13th Annual "Curl for the Cure" Women's Charity Bonspiel was held at the Highland Country Club on Saturday, November 21st. Twenty-four teams from the Guelph, Highland, Ilderton, Kitchener, London and St. Thomas Curling Clubs were piped onto the ice by Ken Webster, London Fire Fighters' Pipe Band. It was another tremendously successful event, raising a total of \$34,581.50 for Rethink Breast Cancer to help support research at the London Regional Cancer Centre and to support public awareness and educational programs through Team Shan.

\$1,070 generated by the Raffle was donated to Wellspring, in memory of **Kit Benson**. Congratulations to Laura Rozon, Linda McFayden and Sheila Dempster, all from LCC, who raised the highest pledges in the amount of \$2,200, \$665 and \$600 respectively.

The total amount raised since Curl for the Cure was introduced to the London Curling Club in 1997 has increased to \$359,702.22.

"Club History: Did You Know?"



The first curling stones used in the early 1700's in Canada were likely the circular metal hub centres of gun carriage wheels, with handles added.

In the latter half of the 1700's iron "stones" were introduced weighing 60-80 pounds for men; 40-48 pounds for women.

Sliding has been a much later addition to the game. The first stones were delivered with a one or two step release from the hack.

The term "hog line" is derived from the Scottish term "hog" for a weak, first-year lamb that had to be culled from the flock.

BOXING DAY CURLING



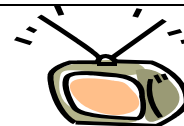
Once again this year we will offer limited Boxing Day curling for our members and their families/friends.
