








On December 10, 1847 the London Curling Club was formed with 19 members. Sixteen iron stones were ordered at a cost of £14 from Elijah Leonard's Foundry on Fullarton Street.











The large building in the middle was the Crystal Palace.





After the Crystal Palace was destroyed, London Curling Club members elected to purchase the Jubilee Rink.

The Jubilee had been built in 1897 for ice skating and hockey.

Fire erupted at the Jubilee Rink at 3:00 am on August 25, 1922. Cause unknown. The rink was a total loss as were 6 houses on Lyle and Marshall Streets. There were no injuries or deaths in what was one of East London's biggest fires on record.




Insurance covered \$15,250 of the \$19,848 total cost to build a new 6 sheet curling facility on Lyle Street.
