## Vehicle Break-in Update:

On Saturday, January 15th, during The City of London Bonspiel, **9 vehicles were broken into on our parking lot.** This brings to 11 the number of vehicle break-ins that we have experienced this year. Your Board's immediate response to this problem was to email our City Councillors, Cheryl Miller and Sandy E. White, to advise them of this event and to request their assistance. By Thursday of the following week we held a meeting with Constable Sean Travis of the Community Oriented Response Unit of the London City Police. Constable Travis advised that our lot will have increased police patrol and that, with our consent, trespassers will be prosecuted. An LPD surveillance team has been observing our parking lot from the teacher's cafeteria at St. Mary's since our meeting and will continue this activity until the end of February. At that time this activity will be reassessed.

Two signs have been posted in the lot indicating that it is being monitored.

The Board has approved two additional signs which identify our lot as private property and that trespassers will be prosecuted. Constable Travis further agreed to increase the Police Patrol of the parking lot during our major scheduled events. It is important that all members be particularly careful about not leaving valuables in plain view in their automobiles; **lock them in your trunk where they are out of sight.** *Personally, I have a SUV and do not have the benefit of a trunk. I have decided to leave nothing of value in the vehicle, Put a "club" on the steering wheel, and leave the doors wide open. Hopefully in this way I'll avoid having it damaged by those who would otherwise break a window to gain access.*



**In Memoriam** - Contributed by Fred Slater**Joe Noon**

On January 18th, our good friend Joe Noon passed away. Born and raised in Hamilton, Joe came to London in the mid 70's to work in the Regional Assessment office as a Valuation Manager. He retired in December 2002.

Joe was the father of two sons, David and Brian, and grandfather of four. "Papa Joe" beamed with pride whenever he talked about his grandchildren. On several occasions Talia came to the curling club to watch Papa Joe. You could see that the closeness and love was mutual.

A lifelong sports fan, Joe coached hockey and ball, played competitive baseball and slow pitch and curled for the last ten years. Due to back pain, Joe had not curled since November. It wasn't until one week before his death that the cancer was discovered.

**Interview : Marilyn Beernink**

Marilyn was very gracious in agreeing to be interviewed by Rock Talk. We wanted to know how well we welcome new members to the LCC. {American Sign Language is her first language so, we communicated by E-Mail.}

Q. Are all members of your team hearing impaired (is that correct terminology)? You seem to follow very well on a team where the other 3 are hearing (e.g. Friday) how do you do that? Some of us who hear don't always follow directions so well!!!

M. All 4 of us (Friday Night Mixed Team) are deaf and culturally deaf. We do not like to be called Hearing Impaired. The word is too negative! (Meaning bad hearing or broken hearing) We follow easily during curling because we use our eyes 110 %. As a deaf person, the eyes become the strongest sense. We do a lot of lookout and we read body language.

Q. How did you get together as a team?

M. We knew each other from long ago. We used to curl at Ivanhoe and were involved in competitive teams for the Deaf Curling Provincial Championships and some other Deaf Bonspiels. We stopped curling about 1990, as we had many other commitments. Then recently we asked the same curlers to play again, as old timers and to keep fit. We hope to find new curlers in the near future, as we have quite a lot of deaf adults living in London.

M. The barrier is communication because that's what we live "through and by". Some of us can read lips and others don't. The best is to write on a piece of paper for clear communication. Small international gestures that everyone can use also work. It would be nice if Hearing adults would learn sign language.

Q. I would like to mention your team by their names in the article, if that is okay with them.

M. The team: Skip Brad Keenan, Vice Marilyn Beernink, Second Larry Brown, Lead Holly Drake.

Q. Have you enjoyed your year at the club?

M. Yes and I am looking forward to playing again next season. I hope to bring more Deaf adults.

LCD is a social club for deaf persons. They feel they have a normal life at LCD events where everyone uses sign language to communicate. The purpose of this organization is to help to provide for social and recreational activities for members.
