RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY CELEBRATES NEW LOCKER ROOMS

The club unveiled its newly renovated locker rooms on September 17th in a ribbon cutting celebration that included London-West MPP Chris Bentley, London-Fanshawe MPP Khalil Ramal, Ontario Trillium Foundation representative Ted Lo, LCC President Don Agnew and LCC Past President, Bruce Cooper.

“This grant has enabled our club to continue to modernize this facility which has been at its present location since 1928”, said Agnew. “Over the past decade, the club has made major upgrades in its refrigeration plant, the interior walls of the curling area, the roof and other aspects of the building envelope, and the club lounge. We are one of the oldest curling clubs in Ontario, dating back to 1848. We are sure that our 700 plus members and guest players to our club will appreciate the new locker facilities”.

The OTF grant of \$50,000 assisted the club in covering the \$130,000 project. Since 1997, the club has spent almost \$800,000 in building upgrades. The project included a revised floor plan for the locker rooms on the second floor and the basement, new paint, carpeting and lockers.

“The Ontario Trillium Foundation sees this grant as a further investment in Old East London”, said OTF representative Ted Lo, “There are many examples of the rejuvenation in this sector of the city as evidenced by many new developments in this immediate area.”

The Ontario Trillium Foundation is an agency of the Government of Ontario. For over 25 years, the Foundation has supported the growth and vitality of communities across the province. It continues to strengthen the capacity of the volunteer sector through investments in community-based initiatives

Thanks to Peter Askey and his committee for their work on Doors Open which gave the club great exposure.

Marg Sirna was a woman of worth, multi-faceted, and truly extraordinary. She will always be remembered at LCC for her endless energy, passion and service to others. She was involved in so many aspects of life at LCC.

In 2003-04, Marg served as chair of the Women's Day Section even though she had not been a member of the WDS for very long. She also convened many events and bonspiels. She acted as secretary of the Women's 2 Day event for many years. Her creativity was evident in the posters which she prepared for these bonspiels

In 2007-2008, Marg served as President of the London Curling Club. She was responsible for much of the decision making at a time of major renovations at the Club particularly with regard to the interior of the arena.

When the time came to hire a new manager, Marg helped with the staff interviewing process. As Past President in 2009 she chaired the Committee to renegotiate the contracts of our staff members for another term.

Concerned about improving the membership of LCC, Marg chaired the Marketing Committee a committee designed to entice new people to join the Club.

At a time when the Club did not have a full time manager, she willingly volunteered to manage the office on many occasions. Needless to say she did the job efficiently and graciously.

When the Tournament of Hearts was held in London in 2006, Marg chaired the Decorating Committee for the event which was at times a big challenge. She represented LCC on the London Legacy Group. Marg was not only an efficient administrator but also a willing worker in the kitchen. In this role she organized the food for events like the City of London Bonspiel and the Briar Patch.

A curling rock has been named in her honour!




