MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT---



I am pleased to report that I have mostly good news to share with you this month. Starting with the most exciting...

Cheque: At our last Board meeting, 2011 Brier Chair, Peter Inch, presented us with a cheque for \$42,077.40 as LCC's share of last year's Brier profits.

Future Projects List: With input from Kevin (head ice technician) and Doug (club manager) the Board is putting together a list of future projects for the maintenance as well as the improvement of our facility. Any LCC member may contribute to this "Wish List" by passing on his/her suggestions to Doug Petch or me during the month of December. When this list is complete, the Board will attempt to prioritize items and establish a rough time frame for their completion, keeping in mind that this will involve some long-term planning.

New Carpeting: With the Brier money in hand, the Board has decided to go ahead with an item already identified as high priority: replacing the carpet in the main lounge, office and central stairway. Deacon Flooring, a longtime advertiser with the club, has been contracted to do the work, between Boxing Day and New Year's.

Learn to Curl: As indicated last month, LTC numbers are down. Only 3 of the 6 sheets are being used on a weekly basis. Since this program is such an important one, the Board would like to see these numbers increase. To do that, we are considering offering "Drop-In" curling during the LTC time slot on Tuesday evenings, during the months of January and February. Pre-registration through the office would be required, so that numbers could be limited based on the number of instructors (and ices) available, but hopefully it can be made to work.

Cancellation: Unfortunately, our Wine & Cheese Appreciation Night for Advertisers and Sponsors, scheduled for Nov. 29th, was cancelled because of insufficient response. Our thanks to Al McLachlan and Gord Sellery, however, for their efforts in planning this event.

VOLUNTEERING PAYS OFF!

Several years ago a group of volunteers from each of the four area Clubs formed a committee to attract a major curling event to London. The result was the Brier coming to London in 2011.

More than 100 volunteers from area Clubs worked as planning directors or event volunteers to make this year's Brier the success it was. Besides volunteers, many Club members supported the event through ticket purchases. They saw some of the best curling in the world. Attendance and profits exceeded previous Briers in Halifax and Hamilton.

The Brier's success resulted in each Club receiving \$7,000 for junior curling plus an ongoing junior curling scholarship from the 50/50 Draws. As well, each Club shared in the Brier Profits which resulting in a cheque for \$42,000 going to each of the four Clubs! This money will be used to improve the Curling experience at each Club and help offset membership increases. We can thank the VOLUNTEERS for this gift!

A Bid 3 Committee has just been formed that include 3 members from each of the four area clubs to attract another major Curling event to London over the next 3 to 5 years. LCC volunteer members are Don Agnew, Dave Rush and Tim Lindsay. You will be asked to support future efforts. Being a member of the LCC can be more than just curling!

NEW FOR 2011-2012: FIVE MORE CLUB COACHES---

Our Club is fortunate to have expanded our existing roster of certified Club Coaches willing to assist others with the game. In fact, they are now busy with plans for a children's clinic on December 9. On the weekend of November 12-13, five members of the London Curling Club participated in the OCA Club Coach Course. Doug Wilson, Sandy Ronson, Jim Lone, Cam Ghent and Peter Askey agreed that this course provided the opportunity to sharpen their own technical skills while picking up excellent drills and fun activities that can be used for clinics at our club.

The course was presented by two experienced OCA instructors who provided top-notch demonstrations of the recommended approach to delivery and brushing. These facilitators were enthusiastic and engaged the course participants in discussions on how to introduce the game to beginners, to make sure that new curlers were safe on the ice and having fun, concepts on game strategy for more experienced curlers, and practical suggestions for improving safety on the ice. Concepts such as never walking backwards on the ice, two gripper brushing, and always stepping on to the ice with a gripper foot can be introduced to novice curlers and serve as good reminders for experienced curlers.

All of us came away with the realization that coaching others about the game is far more than just teaching the technical skills. Our facilitators emphasized the importance of making clear observations and then providing focused feedback that was within the grasp of the curler, the importance of making the learning fun, and the role of coach as a role model particularly with young people he/she may be coaching.

Here are some additional observations about the course from the LCC participants:

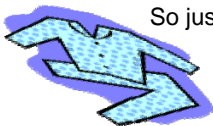

WHAT ARE THOSE LINES ON SHEETS 1 AND 6 ALL ABOUT?

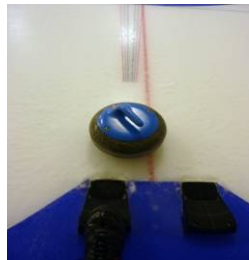
For those of you who have missed the Skills Clinics our Club has provided for free especially the one on October 29th, and wonder how those lines on Sheets 1 and 6 can be of benefit to you, please review the following.

These lines are to enable us to check our Line of Delivery (LOD, or "hitting the broom") technique. They have been well thought out, planned and graciously provided by our Head Ice Technician, Kevin Breivik and his crew. Our Club and its members should be quite proud of this excellent installation!

Many of us slide and release outside of the four-foot lines from time to time when throwing towards the outside of the house. As can be seen from viewing these lines, either by standing at the end of the sheet, or looking at the picture below, with a proper Line of Delivery, the center of the rock should never even touch the four foot line, except for the rarest of occasion.

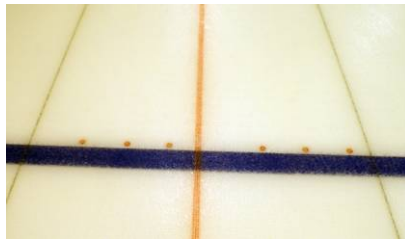


As you can see, these lines (left to right) are aimed directly at: the outside of the 12 ft.; the outside of the 8 ft.; the outside of the 4 ft.; and to the right of center, the outside of the 4 ft.; the outside of the 8 ft.; and the outside of the 12 foot. These lines cross the hog line exactly where your rock should travel to consistently hit the broom when held on one of the above positions. **WARNING:** This statement is only true if you are right-handed and deliver your rock from the OCA/CCA recommended starting point for a no-lift delivery, which is at the convergence of those lines (the right-hand edge of your hack toe) as shown in the picture below.



What if I am left-handed?

Kevin has also provided spots for you at the far end of Sheets 1 and 6, just over the hog line, but you must deliver/start the rock from the left-hand edge of your hack toe for them to be accurate.



What if I am used to delivering the rock from near the centerline and can't/won't change to the OCA/CCA recommended starting point ... are these lines of any use to me?

Of course they are, but you will have to adjust the point at which your rock crosses the hog line accordingly. Look at the first photo (or Sheets 1 or 6) and imagine/visualize that the lines have all shifted to the right so that they are respectively equally distant from the centerline.

What if these lines are distracting me when I deliver my rocks?

You are likely not sufficiently focusing on the broom.

Any questions on the above, or related topics please ask our Lead Club Coach.

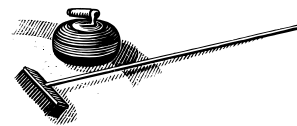
CURLERS BRUSH UP THEIR SKILLS----
